ARRANGEMENT RULES:

1. All Entries must contain some fresh plant material. Fresh plant material includes flowers, foliage, branches, fruits and vegetables. Fruits and vegetables must not be cut open. Some dried material may be used (unless otherwise stated).
2. Natural material, dried and preserved flowers and foliage may be used because of their beauty of line, texture and uniqueness.
3. **NO ARTIFICIAL MATERIALS ARE PERMITTED, EXCEPT WHERE INDICATED.**
4. All containers and accessories should be labeled or marked with OWNER'S NAME AND PHONE NUMBER. Valued accessories such as heirlooms should not be used.
5. Fair reserves the right to move arrangements, in the interest of a balanced show. Please be sure your arrangement is secure, using a base if necessary.
6. Accessories permitted in all classes unless otherwise stated.
7. All exhibits must be maintained in good condition throughout the Fair. Free entrance for the purpose of flower substitution is allowed between 9 AM and 10 AM on Friday, Saturday and Sunday through Jepson's Carnival Gate.
8. Materials used in Arrangement Divisions need not have been grown by the Exhibitor.
9. Size of arrangements is limited to 24" in width unless otherwise noted.
10. **Florists and/or their employees must enter MASTERS.**

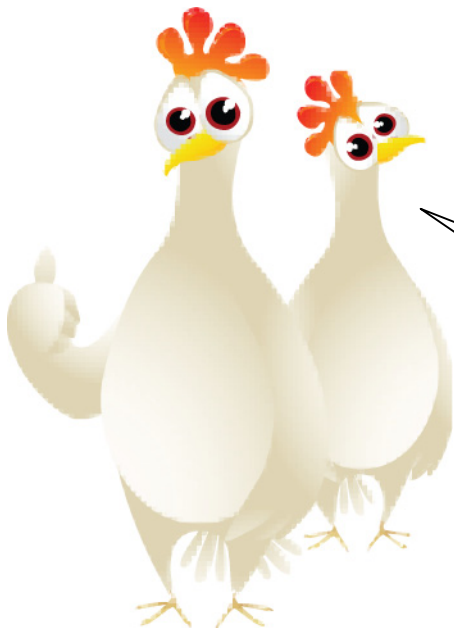

3. Floribunda Spray – Blooms may be at all stages: bud with color, ½ open or ¾ open or fully open. Must be two or more blooms.
