1. **Entries in Showmanship must be made with the entry.** No entries will be accepted at Fair time.
2. Only animals owned, fitted and shown by the Exhibitor in Junior Department Livestock Classes or REQUIRED to be shown in a Senior Department Class under the provisions of State Rules are eligible. Horses entered and shown in the Horse Show Department are also eligible.
3. Exhibitors shall be on hand and ready to exhibit at the time called for judging.
4. All exhibitors are required to wear the official dress described in the Junior Department rules.
5. No glitter on market animals.
6. The Showmanship Divisions will be judged in accordance with State Rules.
7. Age for Divisions is the exhibitor's age as of January 1st of the current year.
8. Swine Exhibitors — Boars are not allowed in Showmanship.
9. All 4-H, FFA and Independent Exhibitors competing in a Market or Breeding Class at the Lake County Fair are required to participate in at least one corresponding Showmanship Class. Exhibitors entering multiple species must compete in Showmanship Classes with one of the species they plan to selling at Auction, but may show with a breeding animal which they have entered in the Fair. **Exhibitors must show their own animals!**
10. Independent Exhibitors will enter and compete in the appropriate 4-H Divisions.

NOTE: Premiums awarded in divisions 378 & 380 ONLY.

First three (3) exhibitors placing in Division 376 may advance and compete in Division 377. First three (3) exhibitors placing in Division 377 may advance and compete in Division 378.

First three (3) exhibitors placing in Division 379 may advance and compete in Division 380.

Only the first three (3) exhibitors placing in each division may choose to advance. Exhibitors are not required to advance, and no "back-filling" of positions will occur if an exhibitor decides not to advance and compete in the next division.

RULES: See State & Local rules also.

1. Small Animal Round Robin will include rabbit, cavy, turkey, poultry, dog, and pygmy goat.
2. Large Animal Round Robin will include horse, beef, dairy, sheep, swine, and goat.
3. 4-H, FFA and Independent Exhibitors placing 1st in Division 378 and 380 will be eligible to compete in Round Robin Showmanship. 2nd place Exhibitors will be allowed to move into Round Robin competition if the 1st place Exhibitor doubles in Species or chooses not to compete.
4. 4-H, FFA and Independent Junior Horse Show Exhibitors placing 1st in Division 540, Class 3 and 5 will be eligible to compete in Round Robin Showmanship. 2nd place Exhibitors will be allowed to move into Round Robin competition if the 1st place Exhibitor doubles in Species or chooses not to compete.
5. Independent Exhibitors will enter the 4-H Division 381.
6. To compete in Round Robin you are required to show all species in the large or small division in which you are eligible.
7. On odd years, Small Animal Round Robin will begin 1 ½ hours after the end of the Livestock Auction, at a time announced by the Livestock Superintendent.
8. In even years, Large Animal Round Robin will begin 1 ½ hours after the end of the Livestock Auction, at a time announced by the Livestock Superintendent.
9. If an Exhibitor wins in a division in more than one organization (4-H, FFA, Grange, or Independent), he or she must notify the Livestock Secretary which division they will be representing by Friday evening at 8:00 PM.
10. Exhibitors who qualify for both small and large animal Round Robin may compete in both, but will only represent one of the above organizations in each.
11. All showmanship winners are required to provide an animal for use in Round Robin or make other provisions to acquire an animal for the competition.
12. The coordinator for Round Robin may have additional animals available in case animals being used are not cooperating safely with the exhibitors or are tired from additional rounds.

RULES: See State & Local rules also.

- Market Steer animals are limited to residents of LAKE COUNTY ONLY.
- Market Steer animals must be owned by the exhibitor for 120 days prior to the opening day of the fair. Proof of ownership will be a brand inspection or Bill of Sale made out to the exhibitor, showing 120 days ownership, or a signed statement, and project record book, showing the animal was dropped from the exhibitor's cow and was raised by the exhibitor. This must be presented to the Brand Inspector or Livestock Secretary weigh-in.
- It is the intent of the Division of Fairs and Expositions that the quality standards established for Market Animals be maintained. Therefore, classification will be subject to change in the event there are changes made in Federal Grading.
- Grooming Guidelines:**
 - All market steers must be slick shorn to within ¼ " of growth (clipped against grain).
 - Entire steer must be shorn, excluding leg area from knee and hock down and tail switch.
 - Hair below the knee/hock must be combed down.
 - Any required touch-up clipping must be completed on fairgrounds on Thursday, September 1st from 9 AM to noon.
 - Any animal not meeting the above requirements will not be eligible to show or sell. Livestock superintendent has final say.
- No horned market steers will be allowed on the Fairgrounds.
- Feeder Classes are only to be used if a Market Steer does not make weight at weigh in time. Entry will be automatically entered into Feeder Class 2 when Entry does not make minimum weight.
- All market steers are required to pre-weigh at the Lake County Fairgrounds. No out of control steers or steers that are a potential danger to fellow exhibitors will be allowed to be shown at the Lake County Fair. A committee shall decide if a steer cannot be entered for the Lake County Fair.

 - No shearing will be permitted on fairgrounds. (exception: animals not meeting above requirements may be touched-up).
 - Any animal not meeting the above requirements will not be eligible to show or sell.
- Only lambs born after January 1st of current year may be entered.
- Market Lamb entries must show BREED, NAME, SEX, BIRTHDAY, CORRECT DIVISION AND CLASS. (Cross Breed is not enough—type of Cross Breed is determined by Breed of Sire. Example: Suffolk Cross.)

RULES: See State & Local rules also.

1. Open to any Primary 4-H Member, 4-H Member, FFA Member and Independent enrolled in a Dog Care and Training project.
2. Independents need to submit a project book with their entry form to the fair. **The project book MUST include proof of ownership, i.e. dated sale receipt or time dated photograph.** Project book should have a journal of feed and weight, how many hours you have spent with your animal, expenses spent on your animal and an explanation of what you learned.
3. Dog (mixed or purebred) must be owned by the exhibitor or family member. Dog must have been trained and fitted for showmanship by exhibitor only.
4. Judging will be done according to American Kennel Club regulations with 4-H modifications. Judge's decision is final. This is not an AKC Sanctioned Show.
5. Entrance by C St. or Livestock gate only. Dogs are not allowed to be walked on the Main Streets or Carnival Area of the Fair. Dogs are to be walked in the Livestock Area or Camping Areas only, on a leash, never to be tied up and left.
6. Showmanship to follow obedience. Bitches in season will be judged in obedience after the regular classes.
7. All exhibitors are required to wear the official dress described in the Junior Department rules.
8. All dogs must be groomed by exhibitor, no adult help.
9. Dogs are not to be left unattended at any time (i.e. grooming table, car, crate, X-pens).
10. Uncontrolled or aggressive dogs will be excused from competition. Any member caught abusing their dog(s) will not be allowed to compete and will be excused from the show grounds.
11. An exhibitor may exhibit more than one dog in obedience classes, but each dog is limited to class(es) it is eligible to compete in.
12. All members will be required to clean up after their dog(s). Bring plastic bags.
13. Dogs must be entered and shown in regular classes to be eligible to show in Showmanship.
14. SHOWMANSHIP: Information can be found at the beginning of the Junior Livestock Department, Class #11.

SUB-NOVICE OBEDIENCE: All exercises on 6-foot leash. Heel and figure eight, stand for examination, recall, long sit one minute and long down three minutes.

CLASS

1. SUB-NOVICE A: For first year exhibitors and first year dogs in the project that do not have 3 qualifying scores.
2. SUB-NOVICE B: For 2nd year or over exhibitors and dogs and who have 3 qualifying scores.

NOVICE OBEDIENCE: Heel and figure eight on leash, stand for examination, heel free, recall, long sit one minute and long down. Dogs that have received three qualifying scores in Novice Obedience at any previous dog show or that have received one qualifying score in Graduate Novice or Open Obedience at any obedience competition must enter Graduate Novice or Open Obedience. No CD dogs to be entered in this class.

CLASS

3. NOVICE A: This is the only dog the exhibitor has trained. Dog or exhibitor has not received more than 3 qualifying scores in Novice at any previous dog show.
4. NOVICE B: All other Novice exhibitors and those who have received 3 qualifying scores.

GRADUATE NOVICE OBEDIENCE: Heel on leash, stand for examination, heel free and figure eight, drop on recall, long sit three minutes and long down five minutes-handler out of sight. Dogs that have received three qualifying scores in Graduate Novice at any previous dog show or dogs that have received a qualifying score in Open at any obedience competition must enter Open Obedience. No CD or CDX dogs to be entered in this class.

CLASS

5. GRADUATE NOVICE: All graduate novice exhibitors.

OPEN OBEDIENCE: All exercises are off leash. Heel and figure eight., drop on recall, retrieve over high jump, broad jump, long sit three minutes and long down five minutes-handler out of sight.

CLASS

6. OPEN: All open exhibitors.

UTILITY OBEDIENCE: All exercises are off leash. Signal exercise, scent discrimination, directed retrieve, moving steady, directed jumping.

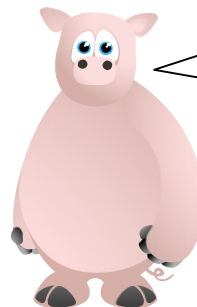
