1. All entries in these Divisions must have been home produced by the exhibitor within one year of the opening day of the Fair.
2. Exhibits must be adequately and correctly labeled as to Division and Class on a piece of paper pinned to the article.
3. Stained, soiled or articles showing obvious signs of wear or use, will be disqualified.
4. Entries in Clothing and Textiles limited to Amateur status unless otherwise stated.
5. Sweepstakes shall be awarded as specified in this Contest Book based upon the following scoring guidelines:
 - A. First Award — 5 Points; Second Award — 3 Points; Third Award — 1 Point
 - B. Sweepstakes shall be awarded only when at least three separate exhibitors have achieved a combined point total of at least 25 Points.
 - C. To receive Sweepstakes Awards, an exhibitor must have a minimum of 10 Points.
 - D. Sweepstakes Points will be credited only to the exhibitor whose name appears on the Entry Form.

1. All entries shall be clearly marked as to content.
2. All skeins shall be 2 ounces, no skein over 2 ounces will be accepted.
3. All entries shall have an unspun sample of original fiber in a zip lock bag stapled to entry, so that the bag may be opened for examination.
4. Sizing will be done by wrapping yarn around ruler for 2 inches and dividing by 2 for "ends per inch".
5. Any entry received with signs of moths will be immediately released and returned to Exhibitor, otherwise all yarns will be judged.

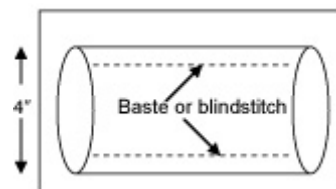

- All entries in these Divisions must have been home produced by the exhibitor within one year of the opening date of the Fair.
- Soiled articles will be rejected.**
- QUILT DEFINITION:** An item of two layers of cloth with a filler, held in place by stitched design.
- CLASSIFICATIONS OF ENTRIES:**
 - Original — designed and executed by exhibitor.
 - Adaptation — from identifiable source.
 - Painting, Poster, wallpaper, etc.
 - Other Needlework.
 - Individual interpretation of preprinted design, chart, graph, painted canvas. Entrant has selected at least two (2) colors, materials, stitches.
 - Kit — Entrant uses materials and instructions included in commercial package, reworked (canvas) center or custom design.
- DEFINITIONS OF TECHNIQUES:**
 - COUNTED THREAD** — a term for Embroidery worked on even weave fabric, whose threads can be counted.
 - COUNTED CROSS STITCH:** Cross stitches worked on an even weave fabric.
 - BLACKWORK:** Small geometric patterns usually worked in black thread on white even weave fabric.
 - DRAWN FABRIC, PULLED THREAD, PULLED WORK:** Threads of fabric are pulled aside or removed, leaving holes that form a pattern.
 - HARDANGER:** A Norwegian Embroidery technique, worked on evenweave fabric known as hardanger. It consists of rectangular groups of satin stitches, known as Kloster Blocks arranged in patterns of squares and rectangles to outline the cut spaces.
 - NEEDLEPOINT** — a canvas Embroidery or canvas work — Embroidery worked on a canvas background — the stitches cover the entire surface (usually) and are usually worked in wool.
 - STITCHERY** — Fabric Embroidery — a term for Embroidery worked on non-countable fabric.
 - CREWEL EMBROIDERY:** Any Embroidery worked with Crewel Wool on a plain weave linen background.
 - STAMPED FABRIC EMBROIDERY:** A term for fabric pre-stamped with designs.
- Items to be hung must be ready for hanging or they will not be accepted.

Quilts:

 - Specify size and pattern on entry form.**
 - All quilts and wall hangings must have a 4" sleeve casing at the top back to accommodate a crosspole for hanging. Fold a 9" strip of fabric in half and sew with a 1/2" seam, making a long tube. Place seam against quilt back and baste or blindstitch sleeve in place, 1" below top and 1/2" in from each side, taking care not to sew through to the front.**



- No Personal Labels may be displayed on articles.
