### RULES: See State & Local rules.

- LIMITED** to youth age 18 and under of Lake and Mendocino Counties only who were duly enrolled in a Horse Project.
  - Exhibitor's age on all Classes is based on January 1st of the current year.
  - This show will be run under U.S.E.F rules unless otherwise stated.
  - Adult's Code of Conduct** on page 76 must have a minimum of two (2) signatures which can be from either/or:
    - All parents or guardians of any child entering an animal in the Lake County Fair.
    - Each leader or advisor providing leadership to any child entering an animal in the Lake County Fair.This form must be completed prior to "check-in" at the fairgrounds for the competition.
  - HORSE DRUGGING REGULATIONS:**
    - A fee of \$5.00 will be charged for every horse entered in the show as required by the State of California. Only the gymkhana horses are exempt.
    - NO DRUG FEES WILL BE REFUNDED FOR ANY REASON.**
    - Any animal given any type of drug within 72 hours of the show date must fill out a written declaration form for each drug administered. These forms are at the horse show office.
  - STALL RULES:** Horse Box Stall — \$10.00 per night.
  - SHOWMANSHIP:** First three (3) Award Winners from Class 2 may compete in Class 3 Premium Competition. First three (3) Award winners from Class 4 may compete in Class 5 Premium Competition.
  - Independent Exhibitors will enter and compete in the appropriate 4-H Showmanship Class.
  - ROUND ROBIN:** See rule #4 for Divisions 381 and 382.
  - Horses requiring assistance to enter the arena will be disqualified from the show.
  - All adults must provide adequate chaperone arrangements.  
**Do not leave children unchaperoned!**
  - 4-H, FFA members and Independents must be enrolled in a horse project to enter show. Independent Exhibitors must submit a project book with their Entry Form to the fair, project book must include proof of ownership, i.e. dated photograph, dated sales receipt. The horse must be under the care and management of the member/exhibitor 120 days prior to this show.
  - In Breed Classes where registration papers are required, the ownership must be in the 4-H/FFA member/exhibitor or parent(s) name.
  - Leased horses cannot be shown for confirmation in the halter classes.
  - Mini** – standing no taller than 38 inches at the withers as measured from the last hairs of the mane. Includes horses, donkeys or mules.
  - NO STALLIONS ALLOWED.**
  - Management reserves the right to split or combine classes that are too large or too small. Any changes will be announced at least three (3) classes ahead of time.
  - APPAREL:**
    - When participating in Showmanship and Halter Class all Junior Exhibitors must wear the following show uniform: Long or short sleeved, collared, button or snap front white shirt or blouse. Ankle length white pants. White, black or brown boots.
      - 4-H Exhibitors must add: White or green 4-H tie or collar, and a white or green 4-H hat.
      - FFA Exhibitors must add: FFA emblem attached to left shirt chest, or a blue FFA jacket, and a blue FFA necktie or blue FFA scarf.
      - Independent Exhibitors may add: A solid colored tie or scarf.
    - Western apparel for Western Riding Classes: Jeans, western long sleeve shirt, tie, boots, and western hat (helmet). Spurs and chaps are optional.
    - English apparel for English Riding Classes: English hunt jacket and britches or conservative wash coat in season. Paddock boots or jodhpurs to be worn. Hunt cap or derby hat (helmet), crop and unroweled spurs (optional).
    - All Exhibitors must wear properly strapped headgear while mounted or in horse-drawn vehicle on the grounds of the Lake County Fair. Headgear must be approved by American Society for Testing and Materials/Safety Equipment Institute.
  - JUDGING ORDER:** Will follow class order except, Trail and Horsemaster-ship classes.
  - All 4-H members must have a "RELEASE OF LIABILITY FORM" on file at the 4-H Office prior to participating in this show.
  - High Point Awards:
    - ❖ 4-H Senior
    - ❖ 4-H Junior
    - ❖ FFA (Senior and Junior combined)
    - ❖ Gymkhana Senior (4-H and FFA combined).
    - ❖ Gymkhana Junior (4-H and FFA combined).
- HIGH POINT TABULATION:**  
1<sup>st</sup> - 10 pts, 2<sup>nd</sup> - 8 pts, 3<sup>rd</sup> - 6 pts, 4<sup>th</sup> - 4 pts, 5<sup>th</sup> - 2 pts
- Tie Breakers
- In classes, points will be added together and divided equally (gymkhana). Example: Tie for 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup>, 10 pts + 8 pts = 18 divided by 2 = 9 pts each.
- Overall High Point Tie Breaker
- Winner :  
1<sup>st</sup> Exhibitor who earned points in the most number of classes.  
2<sup>nd</sup> If tie still exists, Exhibitor with the most first place wins.  
3<sup>rd</sup> If a tie still exists, Exhibitor placing the highest in Showmanship.
- Gymkhana High Point Tie Breaker
- Run-off shall be a "Single Stakes Race".
- Trainers may not be at rail when students are exhibiting.
  - Beginner:** 1<sup>st</sup> or 2<sup>nd</sup> year showing, does not qualify for State Fair, walk/trot only.  
**Junior/Novice:** 13 years of age & under as of Jan. 1, current year.
  - Children of management/officials will be allowed to exhibit (show) in junior classes.  
**Beginner may not cross enter into Junior and Senior classes, except the Gymkhana classes**

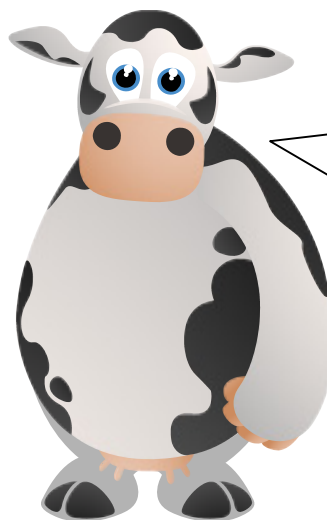
